MASSACHUSETTS BULLYING LAW - <u>https://malegislature.gov/Laws/GeneralLaws/Partl/TitleXII/</u> <u>Chapter71/Section370</u>

Bullying is illegal in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Each school district, charter school, approved private day or residential school and collaborative school must have a bullying plan in place. "Each plan shall recognize that certain students may be more vulnerable to becoming a target of bullying or harassment based on actual or perceived differentiating characteristics, including race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, socioeconomic status, homelessness, academic status, gender identity or expression, physical appearance, pregnant or parenting status, sexual orientation, mental, physical, developmental or sensory disability or by association with a person who has or is perceived to have 1 or more of these characteristics."

All 50 states have some form of bullying law pertaining to schools.
