Next Sunday, which published the Uniform series study, has revised and renamed it [Connections](#). This information about the curriculum is on their website:

...the Scripture selections for *Connections* would be drawn from the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) beginning in January 2017. Sure enough, the lesson texts in the January–April 2017 volume of *Connections* come from the lectionary. That will continue going forward.

The series, formerly known as *Uniform*, has always been based on Scripture texts recommended by an ecumenical team. Until now, the Scripture passages came from the Committee on the Uniform Series, a team affiliated with the National Council of Churches. Now, they will come from the RCL, which is produced and managed by the Consultation on Common Texts (CCT), an ecumenical consultation of liturgical scholars and denominational representatives from the United States and Canada.
