# **Resources Being Offered Specifically to Help Those Affected by the COVID-19 Crisis**

Note: these resources may not be available after certain dates.

<u>Amplify Media – Free Streaming</u> – Amplify, a subscription streaming service, has made several resources free and accessible for churches to participate in a church-wide or group study and children's content to keep them engaged in the Bible, including the Deep Blue Sunday school curriculum video for spring 2020.

Beaming Books Activities & Resources – Beaming Books, a branch of the Lutheran ELCA publisher which publishes children's books, offers a list of links to activities and resources for children and families.

<u>Breath Prayers from Praying in Color</u> - The Praying in Color website shows you how to combine a breath prayer as you pray in color.

<u>Candle Walk: A Bedtime Prayer to God Online Book</u> – Church Publishing has made an online copy of their book, *Candle Walk*, available for a limited time. The book helps children "complete" their day and prepare for sleep, fulfilling a hunger for a bedtime prayer that is not simply intercessory, but offers an opportunity to practice listening and contemplation.

<u>Faith Finders Fun</u> – These are free YouTube videos for children and families created by a group of pastors. They will offer Monday-Saturday faith videos with Backyard Monday, Treasure Tuesday, Crafters Wednesday, Magic Thursday, Science Friday, and Random Saturday!

<u>Illustrated Ministry</u> – You can sign up to receive free weekly faith formation resources by email including activity and coloring pages, devotionals, and more.

<u>Orange Kids</u> – They are offering free weekly resources from their Sunday school curriculum as well as articles related to the coronavirus crisis.

<u>Shine Free Resources</u> – Shine, the Sunday school curriculum co-published by MennoMedia and Brethren Press, is offering free resources for churches to adapt for online learning or to send to families for use at home.

## Free Online Sunday School Curriculum

**Episcopal Children's Curriculum** - This curriculum was discontinued in print but is available as a free download on the website of the Virginia Theological Seminary. It is available in three age groups for preschool to grade 6 and there are three years of material for each age group.

**Episcopal Curriculum for Youth** - This curriculum is available for youth younger and older youth. Like the children's curriculum, there are three years of lessons available as free downloads.

<u>Hesed</u> - There are lesson plans based on the Narrative Lectionary for the Year of John). There are resources for the Year of Luke <u>here</u>.

Lesson Plans that Work - Designed to follow the Revised Common Lectionary, these lesson plans are written by experienced church school teachers using practical approaches to respond to the needs of volunteer teachers. Both a lesson plan for young children and a lesson plan for older children are offered each week, and intergenerational lesson plans are available for many major feast days throughout the liturgical year.

#### Sermons4Kids

This website provides children's sermons and group activities, as well as coloring and activity sheets, for each Sunday in the lectionary year.

#### Virtual Church School

This curriculum follows the Revised Common Lectionary and is available in both English and French.
