- a. You listen to something and record your part along
- b. What's different from the normal method of singing in choir?
 - i. No other singers to listen to for pitch and timing
 - ii. No real-time feedback from the conductor or accompanist
 - iii. Ambience is missing
- 3. Process
 - a. Recording device Why is a phone appropriate?
 - b. Playback device Backing track why is it necessary?
 - c. Single-device approaches to be covered at the end

How to Record (Part 1)

- Setting up phone to record
 - Camera App
 - Distance / Framing
 - Landscape or Portrait?
- Second device for backing tracks
 - Headphones needed
 - Backing track volume, one ear in
- Order of recording / playback
- Time before & after

How to Record (Part 2)

- Setting yourself up for success
 - Review / multiple takes
 - Posture
 - Lighting / background
 - Sound environment
 - Placement of the phone (don't muffle the microphone)
 - Managing Sheet Music
- File sync tips
 - Announcing name, song, voice part
 - 1-2-3 Clap
 - Mention no-headphone "Sync tone" method

Sharing Files

- 1. Size & brief info about Filetypes
 - a. Can I add my name / voice part to the filename?
- 2. Submitting directly from phone
 - a. SMS, Email, Wetransfer, Dropbox, Google Drive
- 3. Downloading to computer
 - a. iPhone / Android

Advanced Tips

- 1. Audio Quality on phone
 - a. External microphones, \$20-250 <u>https://www.micreviews.com/guides/top-10-best-smartphone-microphones</u>
- 2. Audio Quality on computer
 - a. USB microphones, \$150-300 https://www.sweetwater.com/insync/usb-microphone-buying-guide-2/
 - b. Conventional microphones require an interface
 - c. Salvaging Zoom audio









Troubleshooting

- 1. Recording without a second device
 - a. Phone: Acapella, Mideo, Garageband, Bandlab
 - b. Computer: Photo Booth / Windows Camera, Zoom
- 2. Overcoming physical limitations
 - a. Headphone extenders / wireless headphones
 - b. Phone holder
