

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Asking Different Questions

Most church leadership books and church leadership conferences were designed for pastors and multi-staff congregations with over 500 members. Beyond generalized COVID-related troubles, these larger churches are facing very different challenges than your average small family-sized or pastoral-sized congregation.

Asking Different Questions

Larger Congregation Challenges

- Multi-site Growth & Resource Allocation
- Highly Focuses Role of Senior Pastor
- Decentralized Staff with dual reporting lines in multiple locations
- Hierarchical Board Decision-making
- Creating a connection and membership system that unifies members from multiple worship venues


Asking Different Questions

Larger Congregation Challenges

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Smaller Congregation Challenges

- Claiming a vision beyond care for the church extended family
- Faith-Sharing and mentoring of new people (especially since there are a LOT of assumptions that "everybody knows everybody")
- Turf issues, such as Pastor & Board interactions with the (often unelected) Matriarch/Patriarch
- Informal and "messy" board governance work





Know your "Why" Plan for Impact

Many existing ministries may be "nice" and/or meaningful, but are they fulfilling our Christian purpose?
We will all be relaunching in a post-COVID reality with only ¹/₃, ¹/₂, or ²/₃ of our pre-COVID membership.
Triage all Ministries: Stovetop, Refrigerator, Freezer, and the Compost Pile

The Special Gifts of Small Churches

- Can do <u>"whole church"</u> (All Aboard!) missions
- Small rural churches are often the only institutions with permanence & trust, and their members are often the community leaders who know the levers of change.
- Partnerships with other churches and organizations are a requirement to be fruitful, so small churches are often less isolated than larger congregations.

Right-Size your Leadership & Governance





Porch Swing Leadership

- Pastor is a Coach, not the CEO.
- Sit side-by-side, not across.
- Look into the distance together, instead of pushing an agenda.
- Bring curiosity and questions, not demands, fears, or ultimatums.
- Chaplain, not cruise director.
- Let things sit for a while.

Rethinking the role of Pastor in the Small Church

 Appreciate Bivocational pastors as indiginous leaders.

Power in numbers: Share pastors & staff & resources as if 2+ congregations were a multi-site church. Reassess every ministry task: what can only be done by clergy? (answer: very little!).
Don't wait on the pastor for visioning.

Move all your personnel, facility, visioning, finance, and legal board of directors functions under one small, accountable leadership board.


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
