A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

This last year was different; it has been a year of both going back to our Christian Education roots and also introducing so many new things! It has been a whirlwind.

In the February of 2022 we hired Elizabeth Christie who had been a webinar presenter for us for a long time. I asked her to create two monthly e-mails. In February of 2022 Cultivate Faith and One More Page were published. More people open and read Cultivate Faith that any other email we send out. We also started adding new CE programs.

At the Staff meeting in July we talked about adding programing that produces money. Two ideas came out of the conversation: Ministry Membership that are based on Cohort groups; Member Churches or Individual Members can join a cohort for free. People from Member Judicatories pay of reduced rate of \$125 and non-members pay \$150. We quickly added 14 Ministry Memberships and also increased the number of Individual Memberships.

The first Cohort group on Children's Ministry started in September and was well received. In January the next session started with two groups. Elizabeth has been asked about one on one coaching and we came up with a pricing model and a link to make an appointment.

The second idea was to begin charging for our online retreats and workshops. In the fall we has an Advent Workshop and a Multi week retreat, both are online. This is difficult to manage but I hope to think of ways to streamline the process.

Elizabeth was very busy creating content; we created a logo to brand the content, since large numbers of people were already familiar with our Cultivate email we used that as a jumping off point. For Advent of 2022 Elizabeth created playlists that we put on our NEW YouTube Channel and our NEW Facebook page Cultivate.

Even while we were getting ready for Christmas we began thinking about Lent and Easter. Elizabeth created a program called "40 Days Together". Eighty people bought the packet and we made \$2.735. The beginning of something new!

We will also be starting a second Cohort group Game Changers with Kay Kotan starting in February of 2023. We offered it for free to our member churches and we also gained new Ministry members who wanted to attend the 3 month program.

Also last fall, we began to survey both congregations and caregivers on a regular basis. The most typical response from parents describes the difficulty of raising children in this era combined with the relentless pressures of doing and being more than is humanly possible. They are grateful for church efforts to reach out to them and want to connect but need something new and different from traditional Sunday programming. In the surveys we conducted of pastors, children's ministers and lay leaders,

we heard the same themes. It is in our DNA to listen to our constituents and seek answers to any and all of their questions. Our motto is "Everyone has a calling – ours is helping you!"

After the success of "Forty Days Together" and based on what we were hearing from Churches and Families we developed Holy Moments! The Holy Moment for Summer was called SALT, Preserving What Matters.

Holy Moments are downloadable resources for families to use at home with their children. For each season we produce content for Families like the Bedtime Blessing included with this letter. There are also Read Together resources for preschool to high school children, Family Hikes, Collaborative Art projects, over the summer we added a Road trip booklet. We also include three months of the gospel readings with questions as conversation starts for parents and caregivers to talk with their children.

We produce resources for churches to use with families. These include; Family Retreat, Family Missions, Bedtime Stories and Prayers, Parent/Caregiver book club, Blessing of the Devices, Prayground, Out the Door Blessings and Favorite Resources and Family packs can also be purchased to send out.

In 2022 – 2023 the program brought in over \$7,000. As you might guess from the list above, it's only a drop in the bucket. We want to help families cultivate the spiritual lives of their children with stories, prayers, and other simple activities to enrich their time together.

With all this going on Karen Ware Jackson has kept our webinar program humming along. they continue to be a valuable resource to church professionals, volunteers, and other ministry leaders. In 2023, 81.5% of respondents rated our webinars as highly relevant and helpful to their ministries (4 or 5 out of 5). Our live audience has leveled out at just under 50% after our pandemic highs. While we always have broad ranging themes, we've done some great work this year with mental health and children. Last Spring, we did a couple of phenomenal webinars with Rev. Dr. Sarah Griffith Lund one Mental Health and Teens as well as Mental Health WISE churches. We presented very well attended webinars on children in worship, and we just finished an excellent panel webinar on How Churches Can Prevent Gun Violence.

In the Fall of 22 and the Spring of 23 we had 4 webinars on how churches can use community organizing in their ministry with Chris Dela Cruz, Katrina Pekich-Bundy, and Shani McIlwain. It was really interesting to see how practices like one-on-one meetings might motivate a congregation to impact their community. This fall, we partnered with Presbyterian Older Adult Ministry to present 3 great webinars on Older Adult ministry, the Third Thirty, and Dementia Friendly Congregations. As we look to 2024, we're saying goodbye to the always excellent Penny Cannon as our Sexual Harassment Prevention trainer, but we're excited to be working with Patti Berner, a church HR expert who presented a webinar with us in June on Best Practices for Personnell Committees. We're also working on a series for congregational leaders called "From Pew to Pulpit" which will help equip folks to lead worship, preach, write liturgy, select hymns, and more. If you want to find our recorded webiars they are in the Online Resource Center on our website.

In November of 2022 we held our fist post-pandemic in person workshop with the Insurance board called Creating a Culture of Safety in Your Ministry.

In January of 2023 after being with us for 5 years Gloria Burgess retired to do "America's Great Loop". We did hire Deboraht Neal who stayed with us for 3 months before accepting a full time position.

In January I increased Debbie's hours. In the added time she has been able to weed through the recorded webinars we were storing on Go To Webinar going back to 2011. We were paying to keep them there. A large number were deleted and some that are still pertinent she recorded onto Zoom so they will still be available to view. Debbie also was working on our Online Resource Center, rechecking thousands of links, a never ending task.

Karen went out on the road, continuing to visit churches, pick up and drop off resources. She did Card Ministry and Prayer Bead Workshops with Westminster Presbyterian Church. Mt. Sinai Congregational Church scheduled a Card Ministry Workshop and Hope Lutheran asked her to come to lead a Prayer Bead workshop for them.

During the fall, Karen led a four part Zoom workshop entitled "Roots" on Wednesday afternoons and Thursday evenings. During Advent she led a contemplative coloring activity at the Church of Our Savior Lutheran Church during a Vespers worship at Pastor Claire's home.

In the spring Karen Smith and I got back on the road. We attended the Metro ELCA Synod meeting in May and in June I

attended the New York Conference of the UCC. Karen continues to run an online books club, a monthly card ministry, and visits churches and runs workshops. She also did an online retreat for Lent and she worked with Mary Larson to run a Small Group Cohort.

And me, I thank God every day for the wonderful PRC staff!!

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SERVICE REQUESTS 2022 - 2023 We helped congregation members 451 times!

402 were handled virtually, by phone, email, Zoom, Facebook, texts, or from our website.227 were sent follow up digital resources.

42 people came to a Center, either Patchogue or West Islip

6 times we went out to meet you in a church or at a meeting. We also have a consultant who travels to the East end of Long Island to drop off and pick up resources, and meet with Pastors to talk about their needs.

In the last few years we began to take on bookkeeping help for churches. We do not record each conversation or Zoom visit. In 2022 - 2023 we worked with 32 churches; some had just a few questions and others were provided full bookkeeping services.







In 2022 - 2023 our largest expenditure was for staff. In January of 2022 we went to salaries rather than keeping a time sheet. Currently we are living into a model that has some specialized positions: Webinar Coordinator, Resource Coordinator, Cultivate Faith Manager. This is a work in progress. The PRC staff is made up of six paid Consultants, a volunteer Consultant and a part time 1099 Grant Writer and me as Consultant and Executive Director

Member Services, the next largest expense area, includes the expenses associated with our webinars: Zoom and the fees for presenter, rent, phone and internet for our Patchogue office, and marketing which includes our website costs and Constant Contact. We also still purchase new resources and pay for postage.

Each year, PRC takes great pleasure in having this opportunity to extend its appreciation to the foundations, churches, and individuals who make our work with clergy, laity, and churches locally and at-a-distance possible. That would not be possible if it were not for those listed on the back page of this Annual Report.
